



2025 LAW DAY POSTER CONTEST RULES



Scope	Students must create an original piece of art related to the 2025 Law Day theme, “The Constitution’s Promise: Out of Many, One.” The Constitution enshrines our collective responsibility to one another, and the theme urges us to take pride in a Constitution that bridges our differences to bring us together as a united nation. Our civic lives tie us together as one “We,” whether through legislative efforts that serve the common good, through military service, or by working together, every day, to fulfill the promise of E pluribus unum, or “Out of many, one.” (ABA website) Students are highly encouraged to convey the theme in relation to the Commonwealth. Creativity and how well the poster expresses the theme will be the primary consideration in judging a winner.
Eligibility	<ol style="list-style-type: none">Any student currently enrolled in the 3rd, 4th, or 5th grade in a school located in the CNMI is eligible to enter the contest.Only one entry per student is permitted.All art submitted must be the result of an original design and individual effort. No traced pictures or computer-generated drawings will be accepted.
Size and Composition	<ol style="list-style-type: none">Designs must be submitted on poster illustration board or heavy paper.The maximum size poster allowed is 11” x 14.” Posters larger than these dimensions will automatically disqualify.Students may produce posters using mixed media; however, posters must remain within the 11” x 14” dimensions.On the back of the paper, students should write their name, school, and grade. Schools may require additional identifiers.
Copyrights	By entering the Poster Contest, the student, parent or guardian, and school acknowledges and consents to the NMI Judiciary’s rights to publish or otherwise duplicate the poster submitted without payment to the author. The NMI Judiciary may post copies of the poster on its website, in published reports, and in any NMI Judiciary courthouse or other relevant location.
Deadline	All entries are due on or before Friday, April 4, 2025, by 4:00pm in electronic or paper form. <ol style="list-style-type: none">Electronic submissions must type on the subject line “2025 Law Day Poster Contest” and emailed to: mary.glass@nmijudiciary.govPaper form submissions must be received by the deadline at: Supreme Court, Clerk of Court Guma’ Hustisia, Susupe, Saipan P.O. Box 502165 Saipan, MP 96950. Schools may set their own respective deadlines prior to the March 31st deadline to collect their students’ work and make one submission via electronic or paper form.
Judges & Prizes	The posters will be judged by a committee comprised of Justices, Judges and NMI Judiciary staff who will select the winners and the committee’s decision is final. The following prizes will be awarded: <ol style="list-style-type: none">First Place: \$100, and Certificate of Recognition.Second Place: \$75, and Certificate of Recognition.Third Place: \$50, and Certificate of Recognition.
